

From The Pastor's Heart



I can do
all things
through Christ
who gives
me strength.

Philippians 4:13

As I focus on the spring time, as things are growing and blossoming, I am grateful for the seasons of the year and how each season can bring something new and different and exciting. As I watch my grandson explore his world with wonderment and desire to understand what lies ahead each day, this causes me to take a greater pause and reflect upon the wonderment of Easter.

The Easter difference as we share about on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday is about the amazing love that was demonstrated on the cross and in the resurrection for you and me! What an amazing difference, Jesus has modeled for us to live for a cause greater than ourselves.

Like the song writer penned "Amazing love how can it be that thou my God should die for me." And because of that amazing love, there is a hope and strength that helps us to love God and others no matter what comes our way. One of my life verses is found in a letter apostle Paul, while still in prison penned to the church in Philippi to encourage them in the difference Jesus Christ can make in their lives. The verse is simply this, "I can do all things through Christ who gives me strength." - Philippians 4:13

Last week, I was reading one on my daily devotion writers, Os Hillman. He wrote a powerful piece about living our lives with

the Easter difference “for a cause greater than ourselves” may the Lord encourage you as you read these words. May we continue to draw closer to God as we reflect upon this great challenge.

In the thirteenth century a man named William Wallace became the instrument of freedom from England’s tyranny over Scotland. A very wicked king ruled England. A tragedy in the life of William Wallace launched him into living for this cause. Initially his cause was revenge, but soon his cause turned to something bigger than himself - freedom for a nation. When he challenged the commoners to fight for this freedom, they responded that the enemy was too great and that they might die on the battlefield. They also refused to fight for the nobles, the knights and leaders who had a vested interest in gaining more land for themselves versus a pure cause of freedom. Wallace’s response: “Yes, we might die. We will all die sooner or later. But we will die for a cause worth dying for. So that our children and their children might live in freedom.” This story was popularized in the movie Braveheart (Sherman Oaks, California: Paramount Pictures, 1995).

Today, we find many Christian believers living a status quo relationship with God that is characterized more as “business as usual” than a life demonstrating God’s power. Our focus is often more concerned with improving our standard of living than improving the Kingdom of God through our circle of influence. While this takes place, millions upon millions die without the saving grace of Christ. Many other Christians die never experiencing the freedom in Christ that His blood paid for. God has called each of us to live for a cause greater than ourselves - a life that is dependent on His grace and power to achieve things we never thought possible through our lives. This is His plan for your life. The apostle Paul prayed that He might experience the power of the resurrection in his life. This power is available to you and me to live for a cause greater than ourselves. Ask God what He wants to achieve through your life today. And consider yourself dead already to the consequences of what that might mean for you.





A WISE SNACK



The Victor's Cross

Also called the conqueror's cross, the victor's cross is composed of the Greek cross, recognized by its four equal arms, adorned with Greek letters in each quadrant. The top left letters stand for "Jesus" and the top right, for "Christ" (the horizontal lines above them indicate they're abbreviations.) The four letters across the bottom spell the Greek word for "conqueror."
