From The Pastor's Heart

This past week our family went to Liberty University in Lynchburg Va. It was an amazing event as we watched 7500 students graduate. What a sight seeing the huge crowd that gathered to take part in this exceptional event. The words from one of the speakers rang deep within me at the end of the commencement. He talked about what a difference 7500 graduates who know Christ can make in our world and in our time for the glory of God. Then I remembered something recently I read that D.L. Moody once said, "A holy life will make the deepest impression. Lighthouses blow no horns, they just shine."

As we have been journeying in understanding one of our core values, a passion to live the holy life, it has been my prayer, for every Christian and church across our nation, that we would just shine. How does that happen? We know that a finger in an electric box and a light bulb in our ear would only shock us not light us. So how can we be lit up by the holy presence of Almighty God?

As an experiment, the great scientist Isaac Newton stared at the image of the sun reflected in a mirror. The brightness burned into his retina, and as a result, he suffered temporary blindness. Even after he hid for three days behind closed shutters the bright spot would not fade from his vision. "I used all means to divert my imagination from the sun," he wrote, "But if I thought upon [it] I presently saw [its] picture though I was in the dark."

Imagine Newton's experience with the sun is just a taste of what it would be like if we were able to look upon the holiness of God. On Sunday mornings, we have been observing Moses' life in the Old Testament book of Exodus. There is one time after meeting with God that Moses face was bright and literally radiant because he had been standing in God's presence. When Moses came down from the mountain the people had to cover his face with a cloth because he was too bright to look at. And imagine, they were merely looking at a reflection of God's holiness; Moses was able to actually stand and see God's holiness for himself.

The brilliance of God's holiness is unfathomable. Yet, we are told in Leviticus, 1 Corinthians, and Ephesians to strive to obtain this holiness in our own lives. Peter instructed that "As obedient children, do not be conformed to the passions of your former ignorance, but as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, since it is written, 'You shall be holy, for I am holy.'" (1 Peter 1:14-16)

For us to obtain even the smallest amount of holiness in our lives requires that we have an unquenchable desire for Christ-likeness. Holiness is being connected with Christ. This means that we are walking in step with Him by knowing how He lived while on earth from His Word, as well as prayerfully asking what His will desires us to do every day with the infilling and help of the Holy Spirit. And when we open our hearts and lives to the Lord our lives can be forever changed. Then, what D.L. Moody said happens...for a lighthouse does not blow horns only shines. May the Lord's love shine in your life and my life these days as we seek to share the special gift of God's love and grace with everyone we meet for God's glory!

What a privilege and joy it has been and is to serve you as your pastor! We love you all! As I write this pastor's page this completes five years of service here at FUMC at the end of June for my family and I. To God be the glory for all that has been done for the Lord together. I believe even greater days are ahead for the Kingdom of God here in Collingswood and beyond.

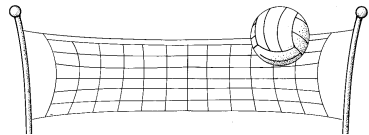

the ryver wide (Wednesday night, 6:45 - 8:00 pm)

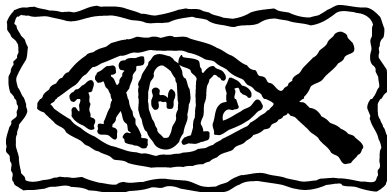
These nights have a very laid-back atmosphere, which allows us to care for each other and talk about the things that are most important to you. What matters to you? Bring it - the conversation table is wide open!

[We celebrated] the 50th Anniversary of the Emmanuel Baptist Church which Alice Ruth and I began in our home back in Indiana half a century ago. It all started in our living room, kitchen, two bedrooms, and eventually in the single garage turned chapel. On one Sunday, before we got land and a proper church building, 140 people passed through our house counting S.S., a.m. p.m. services, plus afternoon guests. How did we ever manage it all? Well, we were a lot younger then. It was indeed a joy to go back for the Celebration and to reminisce with a number of "old-timers." Present pastor/members plan to break ground this summer for a new auditorium to seat at least 450 and (DV) launch a vibrant Spanish-speaking church as well in it's own building.

Three LARGE snowfalls this past winter have mitigated the long and severe drought of this area. Birds are singing and beginning to nest. We are planting seed for early crops. By the way, did you realize that lettuce is the only vegetable that cannot be sold in any way but fresh - never cooked, frozen or preserved ? (Let us know if you can think of any other.)

Dear Friends,

Duncan Kasokason (pictured at left) is a friend of mine, a leader in the Papua New Guinea Bible Translation Association, and currently the PNG BTA language project coordinator for Milne Bay Province. It was he who extended to me the invitation to teach at Alotau this year, and I am indebted to the generosity of the Milne Bay Region of SIL for covering my airfare and accommodations for this up-coming trip.

Teaching in Milne Bay Province will be another first for me. The prospect of contributing to the Bible translation effort going on in ten language groups there is both exciting and sobering. Though new translation projects are being started at an unprecedented rate and local interest in translation is strong, there is still MUCH WORK that remains to be done.

Russian Missions

Dear Friends,

The communities in the lands of Russia and the Ukraine are generally small, hard to reach, and have limited access to resources. While some communities have a functioning Russian Missions church, others are served by periodic visits by one of our traveling ministers. In an effort to help, encourage, and show God's love, Russian Missions continues to send our missionaries into these harsh areas.

Some of the challenges facing these remote areas are alcoholism, abuse, teen pregnancy, and suicide. Since they are so far away from larger cities or other communities, very little support or help is available. Vladimir Makarov from Andropoli says, "March's weather is very often changing...warm one day...the next cold. But still it did not stop me for I must carry the Good News to people in need of salvation. I continue to work in various areas: evangelism in the villages where there are no churches, serving in the village of Novo-Pokrovk, travel and preach in churches wherever there is a need for preachers. One recent trip to the foothills area took me about 50 km from Feodosiya. It has long been a Tatar village but now it is about 40 percent Russian and Ukrainian. People live in poverty, they survive on agriculture and livestock. I went house to house and talked with people about Jesus Christ, giving them the Gospel and Christian literature. Only God knows what thoughts were in their hearts after I left. I am grateful that you support my ministry so that I can implement it in the Crimea. Please pray for me that I may have safety on the trips and energy to get through each visitation. Pray that there will be much spiritual fruit. May God bless you as you provide for all the needs of my ministry!"

Your prayers and support make all of our strategic outreaches possible. You help us train pastors, provide evangelistic literature and programs, and encourage the developing teams in the lands of Russia and the Ukraine. Thank you!

Many were moved deeply, there were those who were weeping and shared with some of our team that they could not remember when was the last time they had heard Christmas caroling on the street corners of Philadelphia.

We were able to pray with a gentleman and shared the gospel with him. Many were prayed for and received Bibles that night and some prayed to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Praise God!

Good Friday was no different as I believe that Christmas and Good Friday service should be held in the streets of our inner-city communities where the Church should be the light of the world.

I cannot thank you enough, those of you who keep us in your prayers, and support our ministry. May the Lord bless you for this. Words cannot express our gratefulness for you. May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with you in full abundance.

A NEW OLD WAY TO PRAY

An ancient Jewish form of prayer, still in use today, involves sprinkling one's day with short prayers of gratitude to God. The prayer typically begins: "Blessed are you, O Lord our God, king of the universe, who ..." and concludes with a phrase that fits the specific situation. Such a prayer works well in good circumstances and bad. For example:

- "Blessed are you, O Lord our God, king of the universe, who has provided clean water for my shower this morning."
- "Blessed are you, O Lord ... who brings friends to support me in my grief."
- "Blessed are you, O Lord ... who has blessed me with a keen mind; please help me focus while I take this test."
- "Blessed are you, O Lord ... who holds my children in unconditional love."

Try using this form of prayer liberally as a way to "pray without ceasing" (1 Thessalonians 5:17) and to weave your faith throughout your day.

A LIFE-FILLED PRAYER

A high school senior in Washington, D.C., offered this graduation prayer, which applies to people of all ages:

Dear God, grant us one thing before we leave the sheltered reassurance of our childhood. Show us life. Not an empty, shallow world of shallow people and shallow dreams, but real life. For we have known the bliss of childhood as well as the passion of adolescence.

We want to make the world a better place, but we don't know how. We want to throw our arms around our brothers and our sisters, but our hands cannot reach. We want to break the cycle of violence and the bonds of injustice in our society, but we're not strong.

Smile on us when we drink from the waters of truth. When we are old, reassure us that our struggle helped make the world a kinder, gentler and more peaceful place. And please, God, don't let us die without ever having lived."



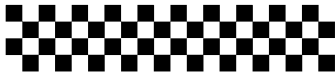

ANTS ON A HILL
