

From The Pastor's Heart



It is hard to believe that after a brutal snowy winter, the thoughts of Easter is around the corner! No more shoveling, ice melt or snow blowers. The hope of warmer days, budding trees and flowers. Oh how we look forward even to spring training news (maybe) as we gear up for spring. For many the Easter and Lenten season is a time that we focus on spring and life. Kind of ironic because we know just before Jesus' death, Jesus also promised there would be the hope of new life!

On Wednesday March 5th, as we begin to observe the Lenten season, join us at 7:00 pm in the sanctuary as we will begin our journey with a special service of meditation, singing and prayer together. (There will be a special time for children and youth as well!) We will also be building a memorial cross with broken pieces of glass, symbolizing our brokenness and how Jesus took our brokenness on himself. We ask everyone that can bring a plate or some ceramic to be broken so you might put a piece into our community cross as we begin our journey of Lent together. Everyone that attends will receive a special 40 day devotional reading guide too!

The word "Lent" means spring. However, for many Christians, it is a time of introspection, and remembering what amazing love and an example Jesus set for us back some 2000 years ago. We need to

prepare our own hearts and lives as part of this reflection. Some Christians choose on the first day of Lent (Ash Wednesday), to mark their foreheads with ash as a symbol of sorrow and mourning over their sin as a symbol of repentance. Some Christians choose to give up a habit or behavior during Lent as an exercise in prayerful self-denial. This might range from something as simple as not drinking soda or coffee during Lent to a full-blown program of fasting. Some Christians commit to a special devotional activity during Lent—for example, daily Scripture reading, regular prayer for a specific person or topic throughout Lent, or serve others you know or volunteer work in our community.

The choice to observe Lent is a personal one—the whole point is to focus your heart and mind on Jesus during the journey to Easter. There's no requirement to observe it, nor should you feel guilty into participating. However, millions of Christians around the world do observe Lent each year; if you've never done so, why not give it a try? Whether you observe Lent in a small or major way, you'll be amazed at what happens when you devote a part of each day to reflecting on Jesus Christ and God's Word.

On Sundays during our journey to Easter, we will continue memorizing our Scripture of the month and also continue "*The Power of One Word Sermon Series*" where many are choosing a single word to help us better live out God's plan for our lives. During this Lenten time we will be looking at key words that we see in the life of Jesus on the way to the cross.

Our Scripture of the month for March 2014 is "*But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus.*" *Philippians 3:13b-14 (NIV)*

As we move from the snowy days of winter, it does not matter what the groundhog said about "6 more weeks of winter." May we pursue the Lord together this Spring, pressing on living our lives out of the love and passion that Jesus has done for us. There is no greater way to begin Spring!





Fellowship House

For the past few months, we have prayed, sought guidance and carefully analyzed and evaluated everything that Fellowship House does, serving the spiritual, emotional and other earthly needs of our neighbors in Camden. Facing such a large budget gap, we were challenged to ask “what are our greatest gifts, and how do we best share them?” In the end, we were struck by the truth in the saying, “when the Lord closes a door, he opens a window.”

The Trustees took the long view that Camden’s children are the hope for a brighter future, and elected to expand and invest in our children’s’ program. The move returns us to our core mission for the first 35 years of our existence. The long-term investment in the lives of our children seeks to prevent many of the unhealthy patterns we find in the adults in our community.

As we pursue this child-centric mission, we will take advantage of opportunities to introduce new wrap-around services and partner with parents, local churches, and other organizations to strengthen the families of our children. The provision of food within this ministry and its new wrap-around services will continue, as the need is desperate. Our goal for this ministry is to be focused and excellent.

Sadly, we can no longer afford the staff or resources to continue distributing food to the general public or the addiction services program. The human cost of this change is having to say goodbye to valued ministry partners: Harrison Davis, who served Fellowship House wholeheartedly for 10½ years and Dr. Deborah Dixon, who brought a dynamic energy to the addictions program. Both are sorely missed and we pray that they will be able to locate their next ministry assignment without too much disruption in their lives.

Thanks to God, we see a window opening. Many churches and other agencies throughout Camden provide food to the general public, including several in our immediate neighborhood. We have assembled an extensive calendar of soup kitchen and food bag giveaway activities for the use of our clients.

While our additions program was unique, a new organization, led by our long-time addictions counselor, Lucy DuBose, is beginning. It is called Faces of Change. It has a similar treatment for individuals with alcohol and drug dependencies, and will temporarily operate out of Fellowship House.

The Trustees view these changes as a strategic approach that will lead to superior outcomes for the young lives we are shaping. We expect this new emphasis will produce organic growth of the children's ministry in ways that will significantly impact the lives of the children and their families. We are eagerly anticipating the new things the Lord intends to do through this ministry in 2014 and years to come.

Dana and Debbie Cherry

God brought us through one of the darkest winters in Germany and allowed our ministry here to remain strong. Even when it seemed impossible, God provided us with a new home! In August, we moved to von-Teuffel Str. 13 Kandern, 79400 Germany. Over the summer our support account fell into negative territory. Thankfully, many of you allowed God to use you to help meet our financial need. Because God provided through you, we are able to continue the work here in Germany and around Europe.

We have no greater joy than to see our children making choices to follow the Lord and to live for Him. This Fall Danielle asked if she could be baptized to show publically that she trusted Christ as her Savior and was choosing to follow Him. It was such a blessing that Dana's parents could come to Germany for a visit and be here to participate in this special event in Danielle's life. Dana had the privilege of baptizing Danielle. Thank you to all of you who have prayed for our family and especially for our children.

What a joy to know that both of our children have trusted Christ as their Savior.

What would a redeemed France look like?

This is the question that was asked to Greater Europe Mission workers in France who met for a three-day retreat near Grenoble. We discussed the wonderful qualities of the French—their

love of beauty, their compassion for the poor, their deep thinking. What if these characteristics were under the control of the Holy Spirit? What a difference we would see in the culture! What an influence on the rest of the world!

Prayer requests: We consider it a top priority to encourage our fellow missionaries. We know they are facing tough battles. Because we raised our children in France we can understand a little better the difficulties and obstacles they are facing as many are learning the language and culture. New churches are being planted in Chantilly, Aix-les-Bains, Loches, Lyon, and Lille. Two couples and 2 single guys are working among the Muslims in particularly rough neighborhoods. Our dedicated Camp of the Peaks Team has a full year round program reaching French youth and families. Pray for the opportunities Sue and I have in two new house churches.

Neale and Barbara Goetsch

My morning walk usually starts out more energetic than it ends, as did our family climbs of years past on the Lakeland fells, so when I read Psalm 84 it immediately became my promise for 2014. More than anything else, we want our own spiritual journey and paths of service this year to be increasingly energized by the renewing strength promised to those who wait upon the LORD (Isaiah 40:31.) With just three weeks before we fly to the UK, we are so thankful HIS strength is made perfect [HIS power is perfectly displayed] in OUR weakness (2 Corinthians 13:9.) Physical stamina may be less than when we started the journey, material resources may be dwindling, spiritual burdens (concern for our brothers and sisters in the faith, and longings for those yet outside the fold) may feel at times like a heavy backpack, but HIS promise stands! Spurgeon reminds us “every bundle of affliction has bound up in it sufficient grace.” We are encouraged to quicken our pace - the night is far spent...day is at hand.

Neale still has two messages to prepare before our flight to England January 23rd. Sunday mornings in Loughborough we'll be in Genesis chapter 5-9; on Wednesday evenings we'll continue our study of Gospel words. In between we'll be traveling to visit Chinese believers and several who haven't yet trusted Christ, and we have a long list of many we hope will come to us in Wysall for afternoon tea or meals. We are claiming His promise that we will run and not be weary, and walk and not faint. And, pray with us that


we'll be able to see David, a Chinese lad Barbara taught in her Sunday School class 10 years ago, who is now back in the UK for university. His parents in China are eager for us to see him (mom may be a believer.) They keep in regular contact with us, as have an increasing number of those now back "home." (Next month we want to share some of the exciting news of what God is doing in and through them - they really are going from strength to strength!) Several others from the UK have been in China over the holiday period with the specific burden to share Christ with their families. Pray with us for eternal fruit from their visits.

Wings of Prayer

***What a person
desires is

**Proverbs
19:22a**



March brings the beginning of Lent this year and I was looking for something to emphasize the burden Christ bore for us. I called Pastor Sam to ask what the church would be doing. He and Pastor Leon will continue to be sharing Words of Faith with an emphasis on “Words to the Cross.” The focus I felt God wanted me to do fits into this – “Unfailing Love.”

Have you ever felt alone? Not belonging? Left out? There may be family and other people around you, yet there is a need, a void they cannot fill. What is it that is needed? Proverbs 19:22a answers this. “*What a person desires is unfailing love.*”

The word “desire” comes from the Hebrew word ‘ta’avah,’ which means “to greatly long for, deeply desire or crave.” Desiring this “unfailing love,” where are we to find it? One source lists 40 verses referring to “unfailing love” in the *Bible*. What is unique about these citations is that **not one** is in reference to any person. They are all referring to God.

How man ever developed crucifixion as a death penalty for criminals I don’t know. It is barbaric and inhumane in the slow suffocation it causes. Hanging on the cross, especially because He was nailed to it, Christ had to be in agony beyond comprehension.

For Him to take on the sins of the world, it was necessary for His Father to turn His back on His only Son. There are some who think this is a definition of Hell – a total separation from God. Christ felt and knew this separation as documented in Matthew 27:46 and Mark 15:34. “Eli, Eli [in Matthew and ‘Eloi, Eloi’ in Mark], lema sabachthani.” Both Gospels translate this as “My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?” The love that brought total forgiveness came at a price that I certainly cannot understand.

I imagine that I am not alone in praying for people or situations, asking that they be healed or have problems resolved as I wish. Understanding that answers will come in God’s time and according to His will, I still have difficulty waiting or accepting some outcomes. (My “word” to pray about is “patience.”) I know that “God is in control.” Still, I look for reassurance. I found this in Lamentations 3:32. *“Though he brings grief, he will show compassion, so great is his unfailing love.”* Even in our darker times, God is there, compassionate and loving. David knew this when he wrote Psalm 90:14. He wrote, *“Satisfy us in the morning with your unfailing love, that we may sing for joy and be glad all our days.”*

As we go through Lent, remember the price that was paid for our salvation. From the unfailing love shown by Christ and His Father, we can be confident that we are loved without reservation. Regardless of transgressions, He is there for us without judgment. It is only through Christ that we can know what unfailing love is.

When saying prayers for those we love and care about, remember that God is **always** there with His unfailing love.
